This is where medieval occultist John Dee lived

This is where London's gladiators once fought.

12. The Phoney Houses, 23-24 Leinster Terrace, Bayswater

22-23, due to tube build are flat fronts with no house behind.

London's best animal-based giant shopping centre-located statue

20. Chaucers Canterbury Tales Origin, *Talbot Yard, Southwark, London*

This is where Chaucer's Canterbury Tales story begins.

21. The Temple of Mithras, *Temple Court, Queen Victoria Street, London*

The ancient Roman Temple of Mithras, discovered in 1953.

22. Fulham Palace, *Bishop's Avenue, Fulham, London*

The Bishop's ancient country retreat and largest moat in Britain
